#### II. What is the conscience?

- A. The moral law of the mind that judges right and wrong Rm. 7:23
  - 1. Every man has a conscience though perverted by the Fall.
  - 2. This is why the Holy Ghost has to convict us John 16:8-11
  - 3. It may be enlightened or unenlightened acts by the light it has
- B. It functions by bearing witness or giving testimony
  - 1. BEFORE prompting the right act/warning against the wrong
  - 2. AFTER excusing if we did right/accusing if we did wrong Rm. 2:15
- C. Conscience can be good, evil, or weak;;
  - 1. Good pure; void of offense to God & man 1 Tim. 1:19
  - 2. Evil: defiled /guilty; seared /unresponsive Heb. 10:22; Tit.1:15; 1Tim.4:2
  - 3. Weak overly strict, scrupulous, and minutely careful; uninformed & unenlightened 1 Cor.8:12

# THE TESTIMONY OF OUR CONSCIENCE

### III. The Holy Ghost and our conscience Rom. 9:1

- A. The Word of God and Holy Ghost need inform and enlighten our conscience so we feel conviction in line with God's moral law.
  - 1. The more <u>softened</u> the more conviction it provides; and faster we notice it; less permission we give ourselves to sin
  - 2. The more <u>seared</u> the less conviction we feel; and the slower we notice it; more permission we give ourselves to sin.
  - 3. The Holy Ghost bears witness through our conscience and when enlightened it will convict us in line with the Word
- B. Keep a clear and tender conscience
  - 1. Acts 23:1
  - 2. Acts 24:16
