THE WAY OF CAIN

I. The way of Cain

- A. Two offerings and two attitudes of heart
 - 1. Abel brought God the first of the increase, in faith, & his sacrifice was accepted (Gen. 4:4) (Heb.11:4)
 - 2. Cain brought God his offering that wasn't the first, best, and in faith & his sacrifice was rejected (Gen. 4:3).
- B. Cain's self deception
 - 1. Cain was angry because he deceived himself into believing that God would accept any kind sacrifice or offering (Gen. 4:5-7).
 - 2. Cain took his anger out on Abel (Gen. 4:8).

II. The way of Cain is a force leading away from God (apostasy) (Jude 1:10-12).

- A. The way of Cain specifically is:
 - 1. A way of thinking in which a person redefines what is acceptable to God that gradually influences a way of living & departure from what they once believed (Gen. 4:3-8).
 - 2. It is a gradual journey because it is a "way" or a road; a travelled way.
 - 3. It is based on self deception (A person convinces themselves their way is OK).
 - 4. It is serving God "my way."
- B. It is a way that starts while among the Church (Cain did bring an offering to the appointed place of worship
 - 1. It makes claims of non-accountibility and non-responsibility Gen. 4:9.
 - 2. Manifests in lack of love for ones brethren and a departure from the faith 1 Jn. 3:13-15.
 - 3. Creates restlessness and wandering Gen. 4:12, 16, 17

SUMMARY THOUGHTS ON THE WAY OF CAIN

- 1. It is a "way" a road, a travelled way, a course of conduct, a way of thinking: a course of conduct and way of thinking that redefines what is acceptable to God.
- 2. It is a road people travel on so it is a gradual journey that leads them to serve God their way.
- 3. It is a force that leads away from God and towards apostasy (since it is listed as one of the six examples of apostasy in the Book of Jude).
- 4. It involves selfishness and gives evidences of varying degrees to a lack of love for the brethren 1 John 3:11, 12. (After lying about it, he claimed non accountability and non responsibility for being his brother's keeper Gen. 4:9).
- 5. It involves offence & self deception as evidenced by Cain's initial anger toward God when his offering wasn't accepted (Gen. 4:5). He wouldn't have been angry if he wasn't convinced that his way was right and OK.
- 6. I believe it happens while people are in Church and serving because Cain did bring an offering to the place of worship.
- 7. They have evil works in their life un-repented of (1 John 3:12) when the light of God shines on it their countenance falls but they don't repent (Gen. 4:6). It opens the door to sin to come in, that is couched as a predator ready to pounce on its prey (Gen. 4:8).
- 8. It can lead to departure from God's appointed place of worship, family affection and association into a restless life of wandering Gen. 4:12, 16, 17.

THE WAY OUT OF SELF DECEPTION

- 1. Put the Word of God first place and final authority. Be doers of it.
- 2. Earnestly pray God's will to be done. (A submitted will is the key)
- 3. Consider others to provoke unto love & don't develop the habit of forsaking the assembling of the brethren at Church
- 4. Continually honor the Lord with the firstfruits of all increase.
- 5. Don't adapt down or alter the standard of the Word to fit a declining culture.
